Update on Reconciling Team

Shortly after the General Conference voted to adopt the Traditional Church Plan, our Administrative Council voted unanimously to be a church which rejects the tenor of the plan passed at General Conference and thus affirm our openness to ALL people. We now have a committee tasked with exploring the option of becoming a Reconciling Congregation. This means the adoption of a welcoming statement which specifically states that we are church which is welcoming to ALL people no matter what their gender identity or sexual orientation might be.

Our first task has been to have some individual conversations with persons at Community of Faith. This committee will be reaching out to church participants to see if there are questions that need to be answered or if additional information is needed as we explore becoming a "Reconciling Congregation." Any conversations between committee members and congregants will remain anonymous. We will also be having some discussion groups and education events over the next several months to help provide information about the Reconciling Congregation process and what this might look like here at Community of Faith. Rob's Ramblings Continued

April 26 witnessed the decision of The Judicial Council which acted upon the actions of General Conference 2019. In summary, the Judicial Council provided no surprises – they affirmed that what they had deemed unconstitutional was unconstitutional (the third time they ruled on the unconstitutionality of some parts of the Traditional Plan) and what they thought passed constitutional



mustard, did. A more robust report can be found in a United Methodist News report by <u>clicking here</u>. The Council not only acted upon the Traditional Plan but also the exit plan – the means by which a church might "leave" the denomination. If you desire to read all the details, <u>click here and search</u> for Decision 1378 and Decision 1379.

What else is happening denominationally in response to the 2019 General Conference?

In the broader church, several bishops and larger church pastors have gathered for initial conversations and have called for a larger gathering over May 20-22 at the Church of the Resurrection. (you can read Adam Hamilton's blogs about this from mid- April here). Each conference nominated 10 persons to attend a conversation about what's next in the United Methodist Church. I'll be one of the ten from Virginia participating.

From a 50,000-foot level, I'm expecting two paths to emerge. One path is finding a way to structure the United Methodist Church in the USA as an independent, legislative body that is still connected to the rest of the denomination – in UMC terms, making the US church a "Central Conference" in the same manner as central conferences in the Philippines, Africa, Europe. This would maintain our agencies and assets while remaining in mission and ministry with the rest of the church. The other path is the developing of a separate, new Methodist denomination (especially if the first path cannot be enacted). In addition to which path emerges, there will be changes in the 2020 General Conference in how churches can "leave" the denomination – the current "exit" path was only adopted by a vote of 402-400!

As you can imagine, there are lots of articles appearing in the religious and United Methodist press. One place that curates a host of thoughtful articles is found at www.um-insight.net. I've found it a good source of reflections.

I don't expect there to be substantive news until after the gathering at the Church of the Resurrection in late May. When I return, I'll offer an update both in person one Sunday as well as in June's newsletter.

In our local context at CoF and in the midst of denominational conversations, our Reconciling Team is working on individual conversations and developing what educational needs and small group conversations need to occur as we consider becoming a "Reconciling Congregation." You will find their report in this edition of the newsletter.

I look forward to seeing you this month at church – there are many great fellowship and worship opportunities to nourish and sustain us. May God bless you as we celebrate the Easter season together.

Mother's Day is a great opportunity to thank your mother, grandmother or any other woman who has been a wonderful example in your life.


Make and give this craft to show how much you appreciate these special women.

What you need:

- An empty, glass, wide-mouthed jar (no lid needed)
- Acrylic craft paints (several different spring colors)
- Votive candle (optional)
- Flowers (optional)
- Small candies (optional)

What you do:

- 1. Make sure your glass jar is clean and dry.
- 2. Dip your pointer finger into one of the paint colors.
- 3. Using your finger as a stamp, make about five prints in a circle on the outside of your jar. These will be your flower petals. (Hint: Hold your jar by placing your hand inside it. Then you can turn the jar easily without messing up the wet paint.)
- 4. Dip your finger into another color and make a fingerprint in the center of your petals.
- 5. Make as many flowers as you want, using different fingers or your thumb to make different-sized petals.
- 6. Present this beautiful gift to a special woman this Mother's Day. There are many ways to use it:
 - Place a votive candle inside to make a candleholder.
 - Fill it with water and place flowers inside to make a vase.
 - Fill it with small candies to make a candy jar.
